
PERCEPTIONS OF HIV



Three quarters



of adults believe that someone's life would completely change if they were diagnosed



Only a fifth of adults (20%)

INTIMACY WITH PEOPLE LIVING WITH HIV



The majority of people surveyed, reported feeling comfortable with physical contact, including holding hands (76%) or hugging (75%), with someone living with HIV



However nearly 1 in 2 (46%) people said they wouldn't feel comfortable dating someone living with HIV

THE IMPORTANCE OF LANGUAGE



agree that the use of stigmatising language could negatively impact the mental health and prevent at-risk communities from accessing HIV prevention services



Four in five adults (80%)

think it is their responsibility to ensure they are using appropriate and non-stigmatising language when talking about HIV
